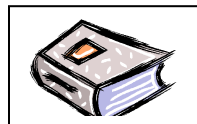

The pool will remain open, Monday – Friday, from 4-8pm, and on weekends thru Labor Day. After that, the pool is open Friday 4-8pm, Saturday 11-9pm, and Sunday 1-8pm, until September 14. The pool will be open for private parties only from September 15 to September 29, and will close for winterizing on September 30.

Dog Day at the pool: Bring your doggy for a swim Sunday, September 14, from 7 to 8 pm.

Pool Party Reservations

Pool Party reservations can be made with Konnie Torbahn, 73 Planters Drive. Download the reservation form from the woodsofparkview.com or WOPHA.com website, and submit it, plus payment, to Konnie at least 7 days before your party. You can check availability and rules at the website. Fees: the party host will pay a \$25 non-refundable fee, due at the time of reservation, and will pay \$20/hour per lifeguard. Zero-20 guests require 1 lifeguard, 21-60 guests require 2 lifeguards, and 60+ guests require 3 lifeguards. There is a 2 hour minimum for the lifeguards. A copy of the current pool rules is also on the website, covering the rules and regulations regarding private parties at the pool.

Arcado Recycles!

Arcado Elementary has a **community** cardboard recycling bin, located at the end of the bus lane, behind the cafeteria (it's a large, blue bin, labeled "Pratt Industries"). Pratt Industries collects ALL paper, books, paperboard (cereal boxes, etc.) in that bin, and uses the collected material to make recycled cardboard boxes right here in Atlanta!

NO laminated or wax covered paper or board please.

All types of paper can still be collected for recycling in the red and green bins behind the school at the end of the bus lane. Again, NO laminated or wax covered paper, please.

The paper and cardboard recycling companies PAY the school for the paper collected in these bins! In the 2007-2008 school year, Arcado Elementary recycled over 21 tons of paper, which saves trees, energy, water, and landfill space.
